



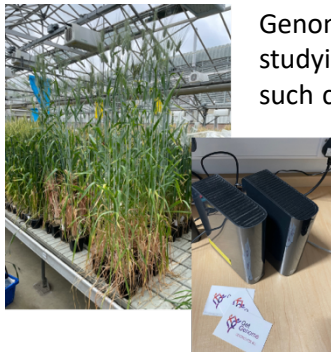

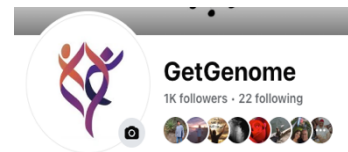
Big Genomes, Local Impact: Treasures returned to Tunisia



Genomics often feels inaccessible for many researchers, especially when you're studying enormous, complex genomes. Well, GetGenome doesn't shy away from such challenges, especially where there is a need for our support. We recently helped colleagues at the University of Sfax sequence two important durum wheat landraces, returning the data home to Tunisia. Fittingly and poetically, the treasures were even handed over in person by a Tunisian researcher! The project generated huge quantities of data, including PacBio HiFi reads, that will become valuable resources to sit beside vouchered germplasm.
